ENTRY FEE:

An entry fee of **\$50.00** or in the case of a Youth/Junior competitor, **\$35.00**, will be payable at the time of Registration. This fee will allow entry into any or all of the sanctioned events (ie. Slalom / Formula etc).

EQUIPMENT:

The International Formula Windsurfing Class rules will apply. (Amendment - Maximum sail size for Junior, Youth and Woman is 11m)
Slalom equipment is unlimited, but a max of 2 board and 4 sails is requested.

BUOYANCY:

All competitors whilst racing shall wear personal flotation devices. (*Please remember to pack a life jacket!*)

RACING FORMAT:

Slalom: Figure 8, downwind 'M' courses or marathon courses (decided by the race committee).

Formula: Windward return (upwind/downwind) courses (decided by the race committee).

Classes: Depending on numbers we will cater for OPEN MENS, LADIES, MASTERS, YOUTHS & JUNIORS. Prizes/Trophies will be awarded to the placegetters in each division.

IMPORTANT INFO:

Authority: Windsurfing QLD and Stormriders Sailboard Club (NSW) will be the governing authority of this event. Competitors will need to be members of their respective association (or other Australian/International windsurfing associations) for liability insurance.

RACE SITE:

Wind direction pending, the racing will be conducted straight out from the beach at the Trial Bay Tourist Park. There is plenty of grass to rig on, then a large sandy beach to sail out from. A rock wall sticks out from the southern end of the beach, which is the end we will be launching from.





ACCOMODATION:

NON-SAILORS???

Not a windsurfer? There's plenty of other things to do at Trial Bay including:

- Swimming in the sheltered beach at Trial Bay (ideal for small kids), just in front of where the racing will take place. There is also a number of surf beaches not too far away, and I'm told both are great for fishing and snorkelling.
- There is an **18-hole Golf Course** at the Trial Bay Tourist Park as well as **tennis courts**, **bowling** (indoor and outdoor).
- There are plenty of restaurants, cafes and pubs in and around Trial Bay and South West Rocks.
- Check out the Trial Bay Gaol when you're there. On the top of the hill, it boasts an awesome view of the bay and surrounding areas. Built as a convict jail in the late 19th century, it was also used as a POW camp for German prisoners in WWI. There are tours available although much of the gaol can be seen for free on foot.
- The view from **Smoky Cape Lighthouse** is also breathtaking, and boasts a good spot for whale-watching in the summer months.
